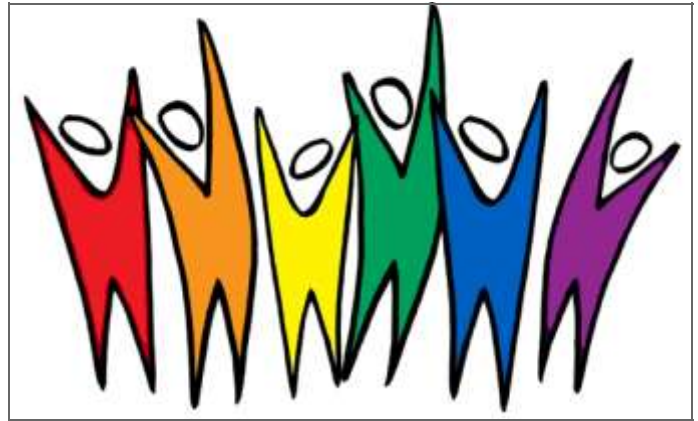

# ST PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH Congregational Meeting

**Council has called a special congregation meeting**

**Sunday Sept. 11<sup>th</sup>, 2011**

**Richardson Hall following the 10:30 service**

**The congregation will vote on this recommendation.**

- 1 – For every \$1.00 individually committed, \$3.00 will be matched from the Endowment Board.
- 2- Ten percent (10%) of congregation's commitment to the campaign will be used to help fund a church passion each year. In 2012 that passion will be a church wide mission trip. In 2013 that passion will be to call a Vicar (a third year seminary student who would work for St. Paul for one year as part of his/her ministry education). In 2014 that passion would be to build a church pavilion on the church property for the community and church to use.
- 3- The remaining 90 % of congregation's commitment and the endowment match would be paid on our building loan and reduce our monthly payments in December of 2011, 2012 & 2013.
- 4- The endowment fund account balance would not be drawn below \$100,000.

Tom Sims and Pastor Kevin will be available in the Cry Room on **Sunday Sept. 4<sup>th</sup> at 9:30** if you would like to discuss this recommendation. Please plan to be present at the called meeting on September 11th.

### REMINDER FROM YOUR FINANCIAL SECRETARY

At the end of July, 23 families were using the system, an increase from 17 in February. As this program grows, benefits for the church include more stable income flow especially during high vacation periods, less teller handling of money, and a more committed congregation to "first fruits giving". Benefits to members include stopping weekly or monthly writing of checks, retaining control of \$ amount & frequency of giving, and a commitment to "first fruits giving". As electronic banking continues to propagate and we continue to grow our participation in the system, both MNB representatives and we are hopeful that electronic transfer is possible in the near future. Our present goal is to grow our monthly transactions to 50 (there were 29 in May and 26 in July). The deposits can be set up monthly, semi-monthly, or even weekly.

If you are ready to sign up to send your stewardship gifts to Saint Paul using the Mountain National Bank (MNB) account, here are the steps to do so:

1. Call me or e-mail me for St. Paul's MNB account number.
2. Go into your bank's on-line bill pay system and click on "Add Payee".

## SERVING MINISTRIES

---

September 2011

Dear friends in Christ,

In the middle of July, Frankie and I traveled across Tennessee to Christ Lutheran Church at Fairfield Glades. They are partners with us in Mission by generously supporting us financially. I provided a summary of who we are, what we are doing, and our progress so far. As part of that presentation, I summarized the make-up of our active worshippers. Right now, we have approximately forty active worshippers. We worship around thirty every Sunday. I reviewed who our active worshippers are. The results were interesting. Five worshippers became active with Cross of Grace because they wanted to be involved with a new mission. Ten worshippers came from other communities of faith to worship with us. Twelve could be classified as inactive. Fourteen were unchurched.

Twenty-six of the forty worshippers, or 65%, came or returned to worship, sharing with one another the grace of God. As one active worshipper said, "We are serving those people of God who did not, could not, or would not find a spiritual home in other communities of faith."

That's the primary function of what Christ calls us to be and to do. That's why we make initial calls monthly. That's why we consistently encourage worshippers to share their faith with people they know who are not part of a community of faith. That's why we have events like, "Cook-out, Cooked-in,"

We were not able to make initial calls in July because of the heat. We focused on prospects that have been identified. Because of that, The results for "Cook-out, Cooked-in" were positive. We will have another one in August. This time it's called, "Summer Feast." Our primary focus will always be mission.

As a result of our efforts, there are two worshippers, who could have been called unchurched, who have been active with us for quite a while. They are Myke Matney and Wayne Waskoski. Wayne was baptized on May 1. On September 4, we will ask God to bless their relationship as they continue their life together.

## SERVING MINISTRIES

### The Gift that Keeps on Giving

Fran Michael, sister of Beth Drane, was an active and long-time member of St. Paul. She served in various roles within the church including Sunday School, VBS, and Financial Secretary. Additionally, she was a Girl Scout leader. Fran was also influential in creating a ministry that thrives today within St. Paul AFTER her death. Fran loved doing needlework of all kinds—quilting, knitting, crocheting, needlepoint and cross stitch. Sadly, when she died in 2006, she left behind a “stash” of needlework supplies including 7 large containers of fabrics. Beth discussed with Fran’s daughter, Evelyn, how best to find a good home for these supplies and material. They knew Fran would want it to go to a worthwhile cause as opposed to being sold in a garage sale.

Beth approached Shirley Lips and asked if she would be willing to help get a group together to make quilts using this fabric. The finished quilts would be donated to charity organizations. The first annual Quilt Fest was held March, 2007. Since that time, one day each year continues to be set aside for a Quilt Fest. Additionally, a group of dedicated quilters work on projects throughout the year to provide a sufficient supply of quilts to meet the targeted need. Much like the proverb of the loaves and fishes, Fran’s fabric, a thoughtful and generous sister and daughter and a talented quilter, have brought to St. Paul the **Comfort Quilts Ministry**. This ministry was born from a gift that keeps on giving.



### Comfort Quilts Ministry

The Comfort Quilts Ministry grew out of a love of quilting and a love of offering comfort and hope to others. We think that our motto – “Wrapping People in God’s Love One Quilt at a Time” describes our mission perfectly.

**Since October 2010 this ministry has given 37 quilts!**

Targeted recipients of our quilts are:

- St. Paul Members in Nursing Home
- Family Promise Children
- Newly baptized at St. Paul
- Long-term hospitalized members
- Chronically ill/homebound members

Once a year, usually in January, we have a huge quilt fest day where everyone spends the day piecing quilt tops. Kits have been prepared so that everyone can focus on the sewing of the tops. This is a fun day, with a lot of sharing and community building taking place. Anyone who sews is invited to take part in this event. We even have several folks from the community join us for the day!

Of course, one day does not provide the number of quilt tops we need so a core group of dedicated quilters continue to piece tops throughout the year. One of our members quilts the tops on her long-arm quilting machine and then the volunteers do the binding and labels.

This is a very rewarding ministry. We have “non-sewers” who volunteer to provide lunch for us on our quilting day and others who volunteer to hand-sew bindings. How cool is that? If you would like more information about this exciting ministry, contact Shirley Lips at
